What started out as a fun get together for the guys led to packed stands of cheering fans, 50/50 ticket sales and some great food & Christmas cheer amongst people who hadn't seen each other in years! In 1999, jerseys and a trophy were introduced. To date, the North has won the trophy 9 times while the South has won it 10 times.

In 1999, North vs South became even more special to myself & my family when Shelley Gadoury suggested that it be held in memory of my brother Jeff McGeough.



Jeff and his buddies would come home for Christmas and were always a part of this community tradition. It was, and still is, a very touching gesture. It speaks volumes for the support we received from

our little community in tough times. Our family is grateful to be living in such a wonderful place.

Shelley later added the kids shoot out, and by doing so, it became a true family event. Even for those who don't play hockey, it is an opportunity to visit with old friends and new faces. A great way to kick off the Christmas holidays! North vs South has taken its place as another great event that continues to show off the true spirit of our great community!
